While my constituents are now back at work, I know they fear future disruptions. I greatly value your presence in Portland and the jobs that Mondelez supports. I think that you will agree with me that Oregon's workers are among the most talented, committed, and productive workers in the country. I hope that you appreciate them as much as their families and I do.

I trust that Mondelez has plans for continued production in Oregon and the good-paying jobs it supports. I remain concerned about the offshoring of good American jobs because of the harm to workers, their families, and to the overall economy. This concern is partly why I am committed, as the Ranking Member on the Senate Committee on Finance, to advancing policies that create an environment so that U.S. businesses and workers are as competitive as possible.

To that end, I request that you share with me Mondelez's long-term plans for investment in our American workforce. I am especially eager to know your long-term vision for Oregon production.

I trust that we can continue to work together to ensure your continued production in Oregon and I look forward to hearing from you in the near future.
